### DATES & TIMES

Friday, May 26th - Monday, May 29th, 2023

**CHECK IN** - time is no earlier than 4:00 pm on Friday, May 26th 2023 \*

**CHECK OUT** - time is no later than 12:00 pm on Monday, May 29th 2023

*\*Meal service begins with Saturday breakfast, so plan to eat before or bring up food for Friday night*

### NECESSITIES

- ▶ **Clothing** – All participants should bring clothes that are comfortable, easy to move in, and appropriate for workshops. Days are warm and nights can be cold. Shorts, T's, jeans, sweats, sneakers, and warm jackets are recommended.
- ▶ **Shoes** – Except for the pool area, open toed shoes are **NOT** allowed.
- ▶ **Packing list** -
  - Sleeping bag or bedding & pillow ● Toiletries & towel ● Flashlight ● Sunscreen
  - Water bottle / Canteen ● Bug spray & chapstick ● Hat ● Fantasy/Adventure themed costume
- ▶ **Costume** - Fantasy/Adventure themed (think Dungeons & Dragons inspired) outfit for Saturday evening's nighttime activity! Make it something you can move in.

**NOTE:** 3 meals will be provided on Saturday & Sunday. Meal service will conclude with breakfast on Monday.  
**NO FOOD OR DRINK** is permitted in the cabins.

## FEES & PAYMENT

**FOR PROGRAM:** The fee for Camp Bravo is \$400 dollars. This includes all lodging, food, workshops, activities and materials. Payment can be made in full, or you can reserve a spot with a deposit of \$150 dollars. Payments or deposits can be made online during registration. **Final payment is due no later than May 8th, 2023.**

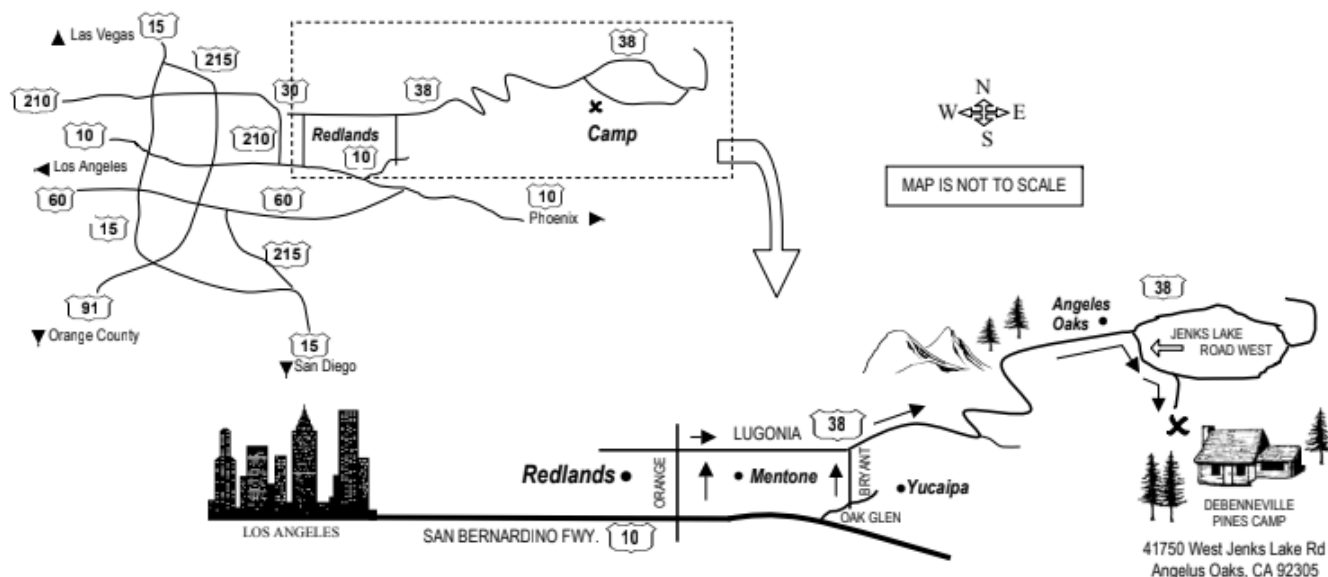

## MAP to CAMP



**From all directions you will want to head towards the 1-10 San Bernardino Fwy in the Redlands / Yucaipa area. Please follow the directions in the box below to get to camp from the Redlands area. Here are some ideas of how to travel to the general area.**

- From the North: Take the I-15 south to the 210 east to the I-10 east.
- From the South: Take the I-15, I-215 or the 91 north towards the I-10 east
- From the East: Take the I-10 west towards Yucaipa
- From the West: Take the I-10 east or the I-210 east to the I-10 east

**Traveling east** on the I-10: Exit ORANGE. Turn left and go north to Lugonia (Hwy. 38). Turn right (east) and follow HIGHWAY 38 into the mountains. (this exit comes up very quickly after the 210 / 30 merge).

**Traveling west** on the I-10: Exit OAK GLEN / LIVE OAK CANYON RD. Turn right on Oak Glen. Follow to Bryant St. Turn left and go to Hwy 38. Turn right (east) and follow HIGHWAY 38 into the mountains.

Once you've traveled into the mountains on Hwy. 38, you will pass through the small town of Angelus Oaks. Continue another 6 miles. Turn right at JENKS LAKE ROAD WEST. Drive about 1 mile to the camp entrance for "deBenneville Pines". Watch closely for the deBenneville camp sign on the right and follow the unpaved road into the camp parking lot. Please park and walk up to the registration area. You will be able to drive luggage to the cabin once registration is completed.



## Friendly Reminders & Code of Conduct

We're excited that you'll be joining us for the Camp Bravo Retreat this year! Below is a list of friendly reminders on what Bravo is all about and what to expect from this really fun weekend.

- Please arrive at Camp de Benneville Pines after 4:00 p.m. on Friday.  
This ensures that you will have time to unpack and settle in before official programming begins the next morning. Please note we will NOT be serving dinner that evening and we recommend you bring your own food. There will be an optional activity that evening.
- Please park in the de Benneville parking lot with your car backed in around the edges of the lot (if possible).  
This is to ensure a quick evacuation should the need arise.
- Please bring a water bottle. No, your counselors weren't just kidding back then :-)  
You need to hydrate as much as possible to avoid elevation sickness.
- DON'T smoke or vape anywhere except the designated smoking areas. This is EXTREMELY important for preventing forest fires. NO smoking/vaping on pathways, inside buildings, in the woods, under gazebos, etc.. You may only smoke/vape directly next to the green cigarette butt disposal containers on the decks of cabins.
- DON'T vandalize or litter. Keep our mountain home beautiful!
- DON'T go into cabins that are not designated for Bravo. (Not all cabins will be open.)  
Also, please respect your fellow camper's space and privacy when inside the cabins.  
Another email will be sent with cabin/room assignments a few days prior to camp.
- DON'T attend workshops or activities under the influence of drugs or alcohol (or hungover).  
This should be obvious, but please respect our hardworking Bravo teachers and staff.

We ask that you please respect the following expectations:

1. You're here for a Camp Bravo experience! That means early mornings, 2-3 workshops a day, plus all-camp and nighttime activities. Come to camp with that "up the mountain" attitude. Expect to meet new people and collaborate!
2. Please adhere to the schedule for the weekend. Your workshop leaders have invested lots of time and energy into creating one-of-a-kind workshops for us and we ask for full attendance.
3. Health and safety are top priority to all of us. While you may want to kick back at the end of the day, we ask that you do so responsibly and not excessively. **All attendees are responsible for maintaining a culture of safety and respect.**
4. Keep in mind that Camp Bravo is first and foremost an educational theatre experience for youth. Everything we do up the mountain as Alumni is in support of the ongoing mission of Camp Bravo. As adults, we ask that you respect that mission and not behave in any way that puts Camp Bravo at risk.
